- Hitler did not want to fight both Russia and Britain at the same time.
- Hitler wanted Poland.
- Hitler did not think
 Britain and France
 would go to war over
 Poland
- He knew Britain and France also wanted to ally with Russia

Why did Russia sign the Nazi-Soviet Pact?

- Stalin was afraid that Britain wanted Germany and Russia to fight a war and destroy each other.
- Stalin was worried by the policy of Appeasement – it was letting Germany get too strong.
- Russia was not ready for a war with Germany.
- Hitler wrote to Stalin and offered him a deal – this impressed Stalin.
